Shew Getachew

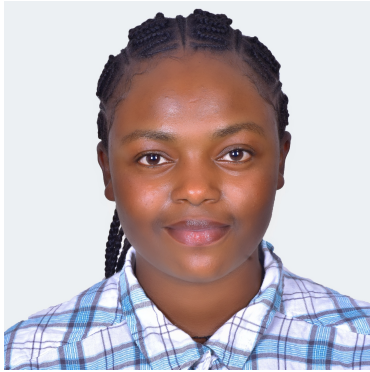
